RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) BETWEEN THE OFFICE OF COMMUNITY AND NEIGHBORHOOD SERVICES, OFFICE OF ENGINEERING, CONSTRUCTION, FACILITIES, AND GROUNDS AND THE TUSCALOOSA POLICE DEPARTMENT-POLICE ATHLETIC LEAGUE AS A PARTNERSHIP TO PROVIDE FUNDS AND ASSIST WITH ACTIVITIES/PROJECTS THAT WILL PREVENT, PREPARE FOR, AND RESPOND TO THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 AND OTHER INFECTIOUS DISEASES

WHEREAS the City Council of Tuscaloosa previously adopted a resolution to amend the City's 2019 Annual Action Plan to create a new CDBG-CV activity, PAL Basketball Court Renovations/Improvements to respond to and prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other infectious diseases by mitigating co-morbidities in a Low-to-Moderate Income Area, and;

WHEREAS, the City of Tuscaloosa has identified sufficient internal capacity to fund, plan, coordinate, administer, implement, and monitor this activity, and;

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires, as a sound management practice, that the City, as a federal grantee, clarify the roles and responsibilities of participating departments, attest to its internal capacity, and formalize its interdepartmental commitment to comply with all applicable federal, state, and local regulations through the execution of a Memorandum of Understanding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA:

That the Mayor, Executive Director of Community and Neighborhood Services, Executive Director of Construction, Facilities, and Grounds, Chief Engineer, and Chief of Community Policing/ Executive Director of the Police Athletic League be, and are hereby authorized to execute a memorandum of understanding for the performance and completion of PAL Basketball Court Renovations/Improvements, as stated above and the City Clerk is hereby authorized to attest the same.
