RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION CONSENTING TO THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF BRYANT DRIVE BETWEEN 6TH AVENUE AND HACKBERRY LANE (OCA-24-0790)

WHEREAS, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE UNIVERSITY OF ALABAMA hereinafter called the Owner, duly filed a Declaration of Vacation of a Street with the City on the 29th day of May, 2024 alleging that they own all of the land abutting a certain public street in the City of Tuscaloosa hereinafter described; and,

WHEREAS, said street lies within the Corporate Limits of the City of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, and the assent of the City Council of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, the governing body of the said Municipality, to the vacation of said public street has been requested and is desired by the Owner; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ala. Code Sections 23-4-2 and 11-49-6 (1975), notice of a date for hearing was duly published in the Tuscaloosa News and abutting property owners and utility entities were notified by mail, all as required by law; and,

WHEREAS, on the date and time duly noticed and specified, a public hearing to determine the assent to the vacation and to discern the fair market value of the land added to that of the abutting landowners was held on August 27, 2024, and the abutting landowners either being present or having jointly consented to the same in the Declaration of Vacation or having waived their objection by their absence;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA as follows:

It appears to the City Council of Tuscaloosa that the vacation of said public street is in the interest of the public that such street or portions thereof, be vacated and that said vacation as herein described will not deprive other property owners of their right, as they may have, to convenient and reasonable means of ingress to and from their property, nor will it adversely affect the interest of the public in any way and that the assent of said City Council be, and the same is hereby, given to the vacation of the following described public alley in the City of Tuscaloosa, County of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, to-wit:

A portion of the Paul W. Bryant Drive right-of-way, said road having a variable right-of-way width, lying in the Southeast Quarter of Section 23, Township 21 South, Range 10 West, Tuscaloosa County, Alabama; said property being more particularly described as follows: As a STARTING POINT, start at a pk nail found marking the Southeast corner of Block 10, University Neighborhood Development Program Area Project No. ALA. A-6 No. 3, as recorded in Plat Book 15 at Page 59 in the Probate Records of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, said point also lying on the Northern right-of-way margin of 10th Alley, said right-of-way having a width of 20.00', and the Western right-of-way margin of 6th Avenue, said right-of-way having a width of 60.00'; thence run in an Westerly direction and along said Northern right-of-way margin of 10th Alley for a distance of 162.32' to a point; thence departing the Northern right-of-way margin of 10th Alley with a deflection angle of 89°59'59" to the right, run in a Northerly direction along the Western boundary of said Block 10 for a distance of 198.75' to a capped rebar found at the Northwest corner of said Block 10, said point also lying on the Southern right-ofway margin of Paul W. Bryant Drive, said right-of-way having a variable width; thence with a deflection angle of 89°54'00" to the right, run in an Easterly direction for a distance of 66.03' to the POINT OF BEGINNING of the property herein described; said point lying on a curve concave to the Southeast and having a delta of 52°11' and a radius of 10.00'; thence with a deflection angle of 26°09'22" to the left and to the chord, run in a Northeasterly direction along said curve for a chord distance of 8.80' (9.11' arc distance) to a point; thence with an interior angle of 153°54'26" from the chord and to the left, run in an Easterly direction for a distance of 127.73' to a point of curvature of a curve concave to the South and having a delta of 13°16' and a radius of 290.00'; thence with an interior angle of 173°22'09" to the chord and to the left, run in a Southeasterly direction for a chord distance of 66.97' (67.12' arc distance) to a point of reverse curvature of a curve concave to the North and having a delta of 13°16' and a radius of 160.00'; thence with an interior of 180°00'00" from the chord and to the chord and to the left, run in a Southeasterly direction along said curve for a chord distance of 36.95' (37.03' arc distance) to a point; thence with an interior angle of 186°37'51" from the chord and to the left, run in a Easterly direction for a distance of 45.91' to a point of curvature of a curve concave to the Southwest and having a delta of 26°53' and a radius of 84.00'; thence with an interior angle of 166°33'33" to the chord and to

the left, run in a Southeasterly direction and along said curve for a chord distance of 39.05' (39.41' arc distance) to a point; thence with an interior angle of 135°00'33" from the chord and to the left, run in a Southeasterly direction for a distance of 45.56' to a point, said point lying on the Southern right-of-way margin of Paul W. Bryant Drive, said right-of-way having a variable width, and the Western right-of-way margin of Hackberry Lane, said right-of-way having a variable width; thence with an interior angle of 15°03'04" to the left, run in a Northwesterly direction along current Paul W. Bryant Drive right-of-way for a distance of 36.41' to a point; thence with an interior angle of 223°15'00" to the left, run in a Westerly direction along current Paul W. Bryant Drive right-of-way for a distance of 94.15' to a point; thence with an interior angle of 158°50'00" to the left, run in a Northwesterly direction along current Paul W. Bryant Drive right-of-way for a distance of 42.26' to a point; thence with an interior angle of 201°10'00" to the left, run in a Westerly direction along the current Paul W. Bryant Drive right-ofway for a distance of 186.61' to a point, said point lying on the current Southern right-of-way margin of said Paul W. Bryant Drive and the Eastern right-of-way margin of 6th Avenue, said right-of-way having a width of 60.00'; thence departing the current southern right-of-way margin of said Paul W. Bryant Drive with an interior angle of 90°07'49" to the left, run in a Northerly direction for a distance of 15.03' to the POINT OF BEGINNING, thereby forming an interior angle of closure of 116°05'34" to the chord, said parcel containing approximately 0.15 acres, more or less.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA as follows:

1. That pursuant to Ala. Code §11-49-6 (1975), and Tuscaloosa City Code § 21-184 the fair market value of the land added to that land owned by the following abutting landowners and publication costs are set out as follows:



Failure by any land owner to tender payment of the Fair Market Value of the lands received and publication costs within 60 days of the adoption of this resolution by the City Council, shall nullify the assent of the City Council and render said street/alley vacation void. Payment Shall Be Tendered By Certified Funds Or Money Order And Payable To The City Of Tuscaloosa.

- 2. That pursuant to Ala. Code §23-4-2 (1975), the City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this resolution in the Tuscaloosa News, a newspaper of general circulation, one time within 14 days of the adoption of this resolution.
- 3. That the Mayor be, and he hereby is, authorized to present a copy of this resolution duly certified as correct by the City Clerk of the City of Tuscaloosa, the officer in charge of the records of said Municipality to the landowners within 15 days of the date of publication of this resolution in order that same may be filed and recorded.
- 4. That this vacation is final and binding provided that an appeal is not filed by any interested person within 30 days of the adoption of this resolution to any trial court of competent jurisdiction and or appellate court of this State and is adjudicated in the appellants favor pursuant to procedures as set forth in Ala. Code §23-4-5 (1975) as amended by Acts of Alabama 2004-323 which renders said vacation null and void.
- 5. (Approx. 0.16 acres located at 1300 Paul W. Bryant Drive— Weaver Rentals, LLC) (BNU to RMF-2U) (OCA-24-1173/Z-12-24)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA, as follows:
