**RESOLUTION GRANTING TENTATIVE APPROVAL
OF TERRACE AT SKYLAND PARK, A PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT
(P-06-24/OCA-24-1370)**

WHEREAS, Builders Group Development, LLC has submitted for tentative approval a Planned Unit Development, pursuant to Section 24-161 et seq. of the Zoning Ordinance of Tuscaloosa; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission has held a public hearing and has recommended that the City Council of Tuscaloosa grant tentative approval of said Planned Unit Development; and,


WHEREAS, seven days notice of a public hearing before the City Council of Tuscaloosa to consider said tentative approval by this Council was duly given by publication in *The Tuscaloosa News*.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA as follows:

That said public hearing has been held on this date and the Council is of the opinion that tentative approval should be given to Terrace at Skyland Park.

That tentative approval is subject to the following conditions:

1. To consist of 26 single-family residential lots and one open space lot. The PUD is proposing approximately 2.5 units per acre.
2. Comply with all specifications outlined in the "Narrative" submitted to the Planning Commission, building in compliance with renderings, elevations and preliminary plat submitted to the Planning Commission and compliance with all conditions in report of Planning Commission to Council.
3. Access to this development will be from two existing stub streets: 53rd Street East, a local street, and 1st Court, a local street.
4. Utilities within the PUD will be installed underground, as required in a PUD.
5. This development will be served by the City of Tuscaloosa sanitary sewer system.
6. There shall be minimum of two off-street parking spaces per lot. The homes will range from 800sf for two-bedroom dwellings to 1400sf for four-bedroom dwellings.

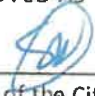

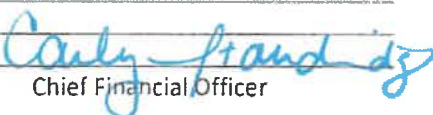

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A SEVERE WEATHER PREPAREDNESS SALES TAX HOLIDAY FOR CERTAIN COVERED ITEMS FOR 2025 (OCA-24-1630)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA as follows:

1. The City of Tuscaloosa adopts the sales tax exemption from municipal sales taxes as enabled by Alabama Act No. 2012-256 for "covered items" as defined in said Act, under the same terms, conditions, and definitions as provided by Act No. 2012-256, Alabama Department of Revenue Rule 810-6-3-.66-.02ER, and/or any other applicable law or rule, for the period 12:01 AM Friday, February 21, 2025 until 12:00 midnight Sunday, February 23, 2025.
2. The City Clerk is authorized to certify a copy of this ordinance and convey it to the Alabama Department of Revenue as provided by law.
3. This ordinance shall become effective upon publication and expire Monday, February 24, 2025. The sales tax exemption provided herein shall apply only for February 21-23, 2025 and shall not apply to any other time period unless authorized by a separate, duly adopted ordinance.
