



WHEREAS, a general municipal election has been called to be held on the 4th day of March, 2025, and a runoff election, if necessary, to be held on the 1st day of April 2025, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and seven Council Members and Chair and seven Members of the City of Tuscaloosa Board of Education for the City of Tuscaloosa; and,
