AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF TUSCALOOSA AMENDMENT NO. 2

(Approx. 4.8 acres located at 1700 23rd Avenue East— Petitioner: Longleaf Engineering, LLC) (SFR-1 to SFR-2) (OCA-25-0124/Z-02-25)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF TUSCALOOSA, as follows:

That the Zoning Map of Tuscaloosa, adopted as a part of the Zoning Ordinance of Tuscaloosa be, and the same is hereby, amended and the following zoning classification is changed and established as follows:

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the south right-of-way of 17th Street E with the east line of Section 30, T21S, R9W, Tuscaloosa County, Alabama; thence run south along the east line of Section 30 to the north line of Cross Creek, Third Section as recorded in Plat Book 2004 at Pages 111 and 112 in the Probate Office of Tuscaloosa County, Alabama; thence run west long the north line of said Cross Creek, Third Section to the east line of Tanglewood Subdivision as recorded in Plat Book 6 at Page 146 in said Probate Office; thence run north along said east line to the south right-of-way of 17th Street E; thence run east along said south right-of-way to the Point of Beginning. Said described property contains 5.0 acres, more or less, and lies in the E1/2 of the NE1/4 of Section 30, T21S, R9W, Tuscaloosa County, Alabama.
