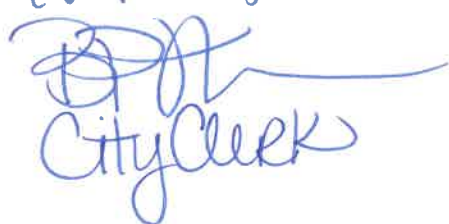

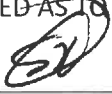

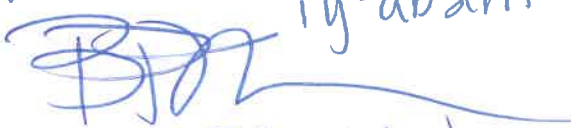

The following projects shall not be eligible for the program: single-family and multi-family residential developments, faith-based and government institutions, projects which received a land development permit (LDP) prior to the effective date of this section, and any nuisance uses including, but not limited to: tobacco and vape shops, payday loan and other alternative lending institutions, tattoo parlors, adult novelty stores and package stores. This program will expire one (1) year after its effective date. The program will take effect on June 13, 2023.
