(OCA-24-0091)

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2024, the City entered into a Subrecipient Funding Contract with The Salvation Army for 2023 Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funds to administer Emergency Shelter, Homeless Prevention, and Rapid Re-Housing; and,

WHEREAS, the budget of the contract in the following sections needs to be amended to redistribute the funds (\$98,280.00), at the request of The Salvation Army, in the categories of Rapid Re-Housing and Homeless Prevention as follows:


- 1) W-I-T-N-E-S-S-E-T-H
 - a. Homeless prevention assistance and services total: decrease by \$5,000.00. This should total \$40,140.00.
 - b. Housing relocation and stabilization services (rapid re-housing) total: increase by \$5,000.00. This should total \$9,000.00.

- 2) II. Services
 - a. Homeless prevention assistance and services total: decrease by \$5,000.00. This should total \$40,140.00.

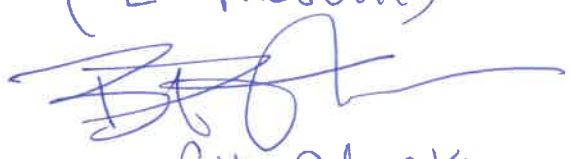

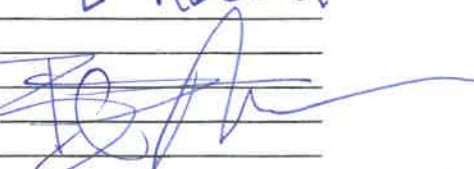
